SPARC: <u>Supporting Sexual Recovery for Women</u> with Bladder Cancer, led by Rebecca Martin at The Royal Marsden NHS. This study explores women's experiences after radical cystectomy and the support challenges clinicians face. Its findings will shape a new co-designed educational intervention to improve personalised post-treatment care.



NICE approval, a new treatment option

We are especially pleased to share that NICE has recently approved a new targeted bladder cancer treatment, available as a take-at-home tablet. This is a significant step forward for patient choice and quality of life.

Bladder cancer research has long been underfunded, with little progress in treatments for decades. This approval is a key milestone and highlights the need for continued investment and innovation.


